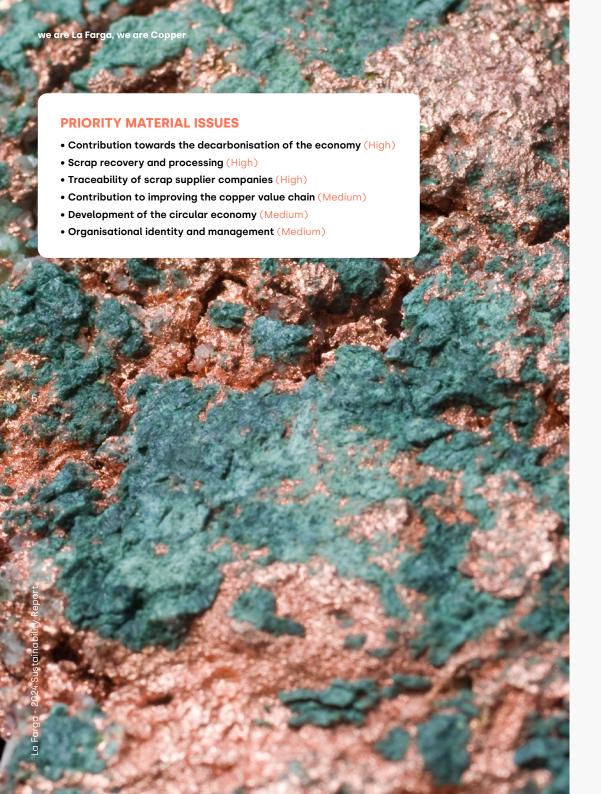

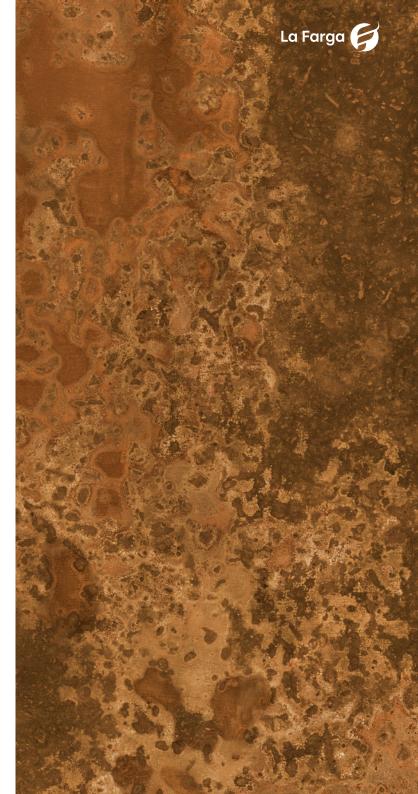

We do this by focusing on competitiveness and the development of profitable and sustainable industrial models. At La Farga, we have been transforming a copper, an extraordinary metal, for more than 216 years. We are a family-owned industrial company in the metallurgical sector that has evolved generation after generation, providing copper and copper alloys solutions to strategic sectors such as renewable energy, automotive, e-mobility, electrification, digitalisation and the railway sector.

Our beginnings date back to 1808, with a small foundry in the Barceloneta neighbourhood dedicated to the production of copper and bronze objects for the Catalan sailing navy. In 1852, the decision was made to build a copper forge next to the Ter river to benefit from its hydraulic power. This would later become La Farga's current headquarters in **Les Masies** de Voltregà (Barcelona). In 2010, we took a decisive step in our **international expansion** by establishing a joint venture in the United States, where we implemented our ground-breaking copper recycling technology. This is located in Indiana and has more than 140 employees, a turnover of 1.452 billion dollars and its main market is America.

Our purpose is clear: "To maximise the use of recycled copper and promote the technologies that make it possible".

Our commitment to providing sustainable solutions and our strong principles and values position us as a forward-thinking strategic industry, fully aligned with Europe's growth needs. And we do so based on the five pillars that define us:

01 We are Copper

We are highly experienced in copper handling and we know how to process it efficiently to maximise its value and reduce its impact. Copper is a strategic metal: an excellent electrical and thermal conductor that is also infinitely recyclable without losing any of its properties and key to the energy transition and the electrification of the planet. At La Farga, we leverage all these qualities to provide a solution to the challenges of well-being, development, efficiency and circularity.

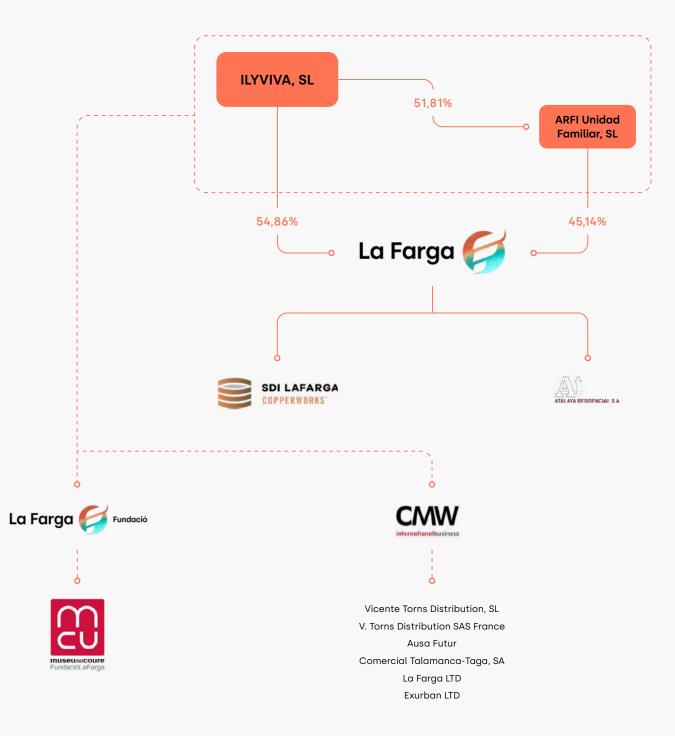

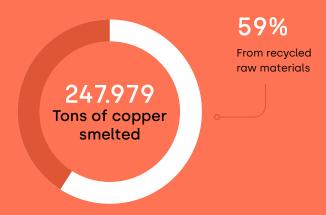

In a context of re-industrialisation, strengthening the supply chain and commitment to clean technologies, La Farga offers a solution aligned with the defined challenges.

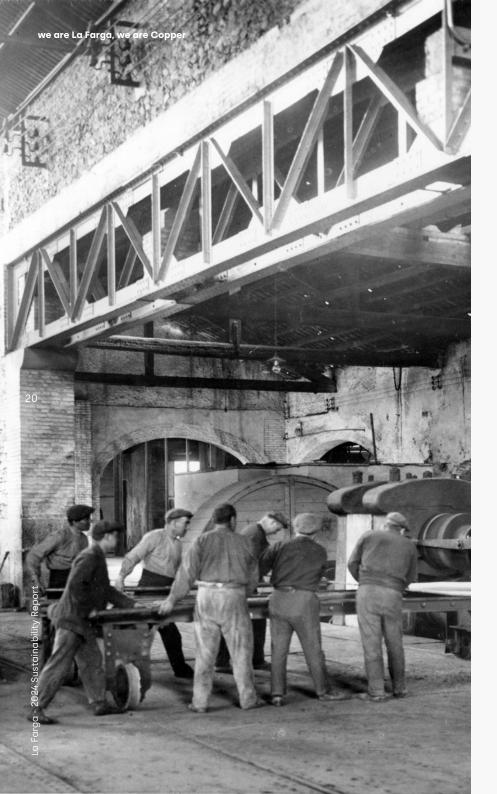

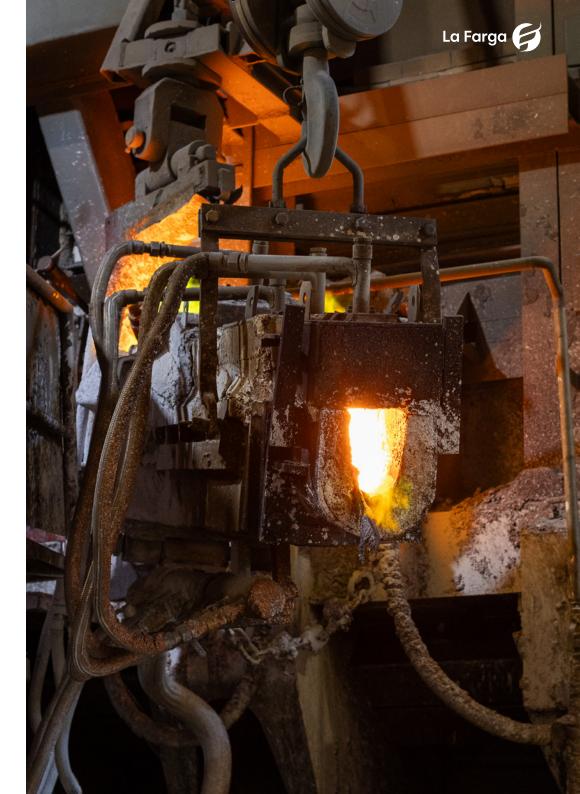

We therefore continued to consolidate a robust, transparent economic model focused on longterm value creation throughout 2024.

Our stringent and responsible management model allowed us to strengthen our financial structure, ensuring not only current stability but also the ability to continue investing in innovation, sustainability and solutions that generate real impact for the development of society.

We have comprehensive credit risk control in place, ensuring coverage of more than 90% of our commercial risk with customers through specific insurance policies. All our tangible assets are also protected against damage and theft, which reinforces our operational resilience.

In an environment marked by volatile international markets, at La Farga, we also have bolstered our commodity hedging policies. Hedging 100% of the value of our metals transactions through the London Metal Exchange (LME), with highly reliable brokers, allows us to guarantee stable margins and sustained competitiveness, minimising the impact of external fluctuations.

Our business requires a high level of working capital financing due to the high value of the raw materials we work with, which we do thanks to our solid financial system adapted to the specific features of our sector. Investments are also financed with long-term instruments, the expected returns of which far exceed the repayment of principal and debt service, thus ensuring their viability and their contribution to the group's strategic growth.

Sound management of financial funds, both those generated by our own business and those obtained from our financial stakeholders, has been key to our continued sustainable growth. This responsible management allows us to reinvest with a vision for the future, boost our competitive position and develop projects with a high economic, social and environmental impact.

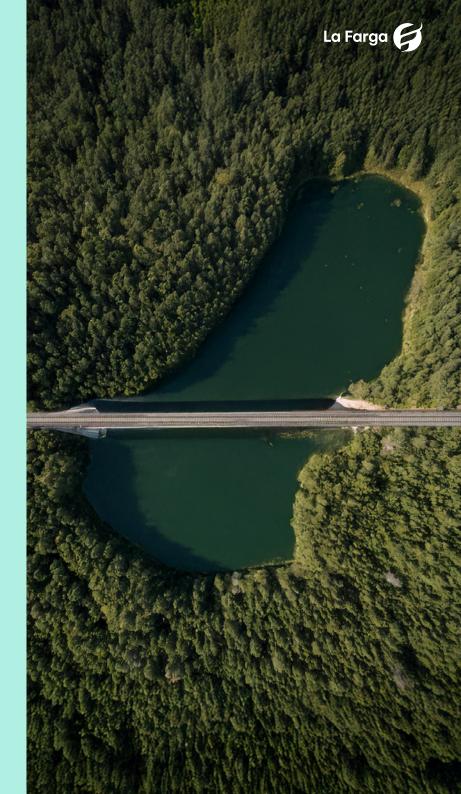

This year, we updated our Code of Conduct, reaffirming our commitment to the highest standards of business ethics and governance. We also continue to bolster our monitoring and control systems with the aim of consolidating a work environment based on trust, respect and responsibility.

In line with this commitment, we have also made progress on our **Equality Plan**, promoting training for the entire team and increase awareness. These initiatives aim to guarantee equal opportunities, prevent all forms of discrimination and consolidate an inclusive, harassment-free work environment. We will continue working on an Outreach and Awareness Plan in 2025, to give greater visibility to the measures implemented and enhance prevention and response mechanisms related to equality.







NEW VERSION OF THE CODE OF CONDUCT

At La Farga, our commitment to ethics, integrity and responsible behaviour is an essential part of our corporate culture. We have a Code of Conduct in place that establishes the principles and values that guide our actions across all levels of the organisation.

This year, we conducted a comprehensive review and update of this Code with the aim of strengthening its alignment with the company's current reality and with an increasingly demanding business and social environment.

This document contains the **principles, values and performance criteria** that govern our activities and applies to both our team and all parties with whom we collaborate. It strives to guarantee management based on **integrity, honesty, responsibility and transparency.** This upgrading reaffirms our commitment to continue moving toward a more ethical, transparent and committed governance model for our stakeholders.

The Code of Conduct also reaffirms our commitment to complying with all current rules and regulations, ensuring that our activities are conducted in accordance with the highest standards of business ethics

HUMAN RIGHTS AND EQUALITY PLAN

La Farga maintains a firm commitment to respecting and protecting human rights in all its operations, ensuring a fair, safe and discrimination-free work environment. Our policy in this area is based on the principles established in the Universal Declaration of Human Rights and the ILO's international labour standards.

Guaranteeing a safe and harassment-free environment At La Farga, gender equality is an essential pillar that recognises and values human potential in its entirety. By fostering an inclusive and diverse environment, we encourage innovation and creativity and promote equal access to educational, economic and leadership opportunities. This commitment is especially relevant in the metalworking sector, where inequality has historically affected women.

The presence of women in the industrial environment and especially in the metalworking sector, continues to be a structural challenge. This is a reality present in society and in the structure of the sector, which restricts access of female talent in these environments. La Farga is addressing this challenge by actively working to reverse this reality and promote a more inclusive environment. Therefore, our strategy is geared toward transforming the sector by progressively incorporating women into the team, as reflected by the fact that 22% of new hires in 2024 will be female and that 22% of the management committee is currently made up of female leaders. The equality plan also promotes training and awareness-raising actions aimed at the entire team, with the aim of ensuring equal opportunities and preventing any form of discrimination. Mandatory training sessions were held for management, staff and specialists in October and November, covering relevant concepts related to gender equality and equity, stereotypes, roles, inclusive language and harassment. We also conducted an internal questionnaire as a further measure to assess the level of awareness and understanding of key concepts related to equality. The assessment reflected a 75% correct response rate, allowing us to identify progress and opportunities for improvement in shared knowledge. The impact of these initiatives encourages us to continue promoting an inclusive and equal environment for all that is harassment-free.

We continued to bolster our actions in 2024 regarding equal opportunities, ensuring compliance with legal standards and promoting greater awareness within the organisation. We will continue working on an Outreach and awareness plan for 2025 that will give greater visibility to the measures implemented, strengthening prevention and response mechanisms related to equality.

Part of this commitment involves the provision of specific training to women in key operational areas, with the aim of strengthening their preparedness to address potential situations of inequality or abuse. We have also identified workplace improvements that will be progressively implemented to ensure equal conditions throughout the company.

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ETHICS COMMITTEE

The purpose of the Ethics Committee is to ensure that La Farga operates in accordance with ethical principles and corporate values, promoting integrity, responsibility and regulatory compliance in all its activities and business relationships.

Provide support and guidance to management and all departments on ethical dilemmas and actions to strengthen the culture of integrity

INTEGRITY AND GOOD GOVERNANCE **POLICIES**

La Farga has a set of internal policies in place to ensure an ethical and transparent framework, which regulate various aspects of business management, upping our game in the fight against corruption, bribery and money laundering.

La Farga maintains a focus on continuous improvement in our internal regulatory framework, continually reviewing and adapting our policies to ensure their alignment with the evolving regulatory, social and business environment. Following the Code of Conduct update in 2024, we will continue this active review process throughout 2025, ensuring that all related policies meet current requirements and continue to strengthen our culture of integrity, ethics and corporate responsibility.

REPORTING CHANNEL AND PREVENTION MECHANISMS

La Farga has an **internal Reporting Channel**, managed by the **Ethics Committee**, which allows any potential violations, irregularities, or conduct contrary to the law or our **Code of Conduct** to be reported confidentially and securely.

This tool is accessible to the entire La Farga team, as well as to suppliers, customers and any other person or entity we interact with, offering the option of reporting any incident or concern they feel is necessary either anonymously or with their name.

We bolstered this channel in 2023 by implementing an Internal Information System, which facilitates direct communication with the organisation and improves the detection, management and monitoring of potential regulatory non-compliance, helping to consolidate an environment of trust, transparency and integrity.

UPGRADING OF THE HARASSMENT PREVENTION PROTOCOL

This year, we updated our **Protocol** for the prevention, detection and response to situations of workplace harassment, including sexual harassment, harassment based on sex, sexual orientation and gender identity and expression, with the aim of strengthening prevention and response measures and ensuring a safe and respectful work environment.

This document establishes clear mechanisms for the **detection**, **reporting and management** of any harassment, ensuring an effective response and protecting the rights of all employees.

We also aligned the protocol with current regulations and the highest standards in workplace well-being. The main actions include:

Prevention and awareness measures, which reinforce training and awareness for the entire team

Confidential, accessible and safe reporting channels, with a clear and effective management procedure

Commitment to non-retaliation, ensuring that everyone can report without fear of any negative consequences

Supervision and monitoring, ensuring that the measures adopted are effective and aligned with best practices in equality and diversity

This update allows us to reaffirm our commitment to a work environment based on respect, equality and safety, promoting an organisational culture free of any discrimination and harassment.



RISK MANAGEMENT

Pre-empt in order to lead: Risk management as a competitive edge "We identify opportunities, mitigate impacts and strengthen our resilience"

In a constantly changing world, proactively managing risks is essential for La Farga to remain sustainable, competitive and resilient. We not only respond to challenges as they arise but also work with a long-term strategic vision that allows us to anticipate scenarios, strengthen our capabilities and ensure business viability in a constantly changing global environment.

Our risk map allows us to identify, assess and prioritise risks based on their impact and likelihood, covering everything from operational and financial aspects to regulatory, environmental and reputational factors. This structured approach is complemented by a criminal risk prevention model that reinforces our commitment to regulatory compliance, business ethics and transparency across all our processes.

Physical and transition risks

We assess the impacts of climate change—such as extreme weather events or resource constraints—and the implications of the transition to low-carbon production models, such as new environmental regulations or changes in customer and investor expectations

Regulatory and compliance risks

We thoroughly monitor national and international regulatory developments, ensuring alignment with standards such as CSRD, European Taxonomy, GRI and SBTi, to name a few, through ongoing advice from top-tier law firms on tax, commercial and environmental matters

Reputational risks

In a context of growing social demands, we have strengthened our transparency, communication and governance policies to protect our social licence to operate and consolidate stakeholder trust

Financial Risks

: In a sector exposed to high volatility, La Farga has consolidated a robust financial risk management model, based on preventive policies and hedging mechanisms designed to protect the company's stability:

- All our copper purchase and sale transactions are covered by hedge policies that eliminate the risk arising from fluctuations in the price of metal.
- We apply specific hedging for foreign exchange and energy (gas and electricity) transactions, with the aim of guaranteeing margins and reducing exposure to market risk.
- We have insurance policies for all assets, as well as above-average coverage for civil liability and environmental protection.
- We have transportation insurance to mitigate risks associated with logistics and theft from external fleets.

- All our sales are insured, without which, the operation cannot be completed. This hedging covers 100% in the majority of cases, ensuring security throughout the collection chain.
- We activate specific insurance policies that protect against potential defaults for commercial transactions with suppliers that involve advance payments, particularly in terms of investments.

Strategic opportunities

Risk identification also allows us to discover opportunities. We work towards transforming the challenges of the context into drivers for innovation, focusing on the development of new products with recycled copper, energy efficiency, industrial digitalisation and the opening of new markets aligned with the ecological transition.

This comprehensive approach has allowed us to continue to strengthen our position as a solid, prepared and leading company in sustainability, capable of anticipating and responding

prepared and leading company in sustainability, capable of anticipating and responding effectively to the risks that impact our business and our environment.

CORPORATE GOVERNANCE AND ORGANISATIONAL STRUCTURE

Solid structures and a long-term vision to ensure continuity and development

As a family-run business, Ilyviva and La Farga maintains a firm commitment to preserving the family-business relationship and building a solid and sustainable corporate governance model. Our governance structure is designed to guarantee the professional management of the company, foster transparency and ensure the continuity of the business project across generations.

Our corporate structure has become more robust with the recent **shareholder reshuffle**, consolidating **ILYVIVA**, SL as the majority shareholder with a **78.24% stake in La Farga yourcoppersolutions**, while ARFI Unidad Familiar, SL holds the remaining 21.76%.

This process seeks to strengthen the stability of the family business and ensure long-term strategic alignment, facilitating generational succession and consolidating **La Farga**'s legacy.

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CORPORATE AND GOVERNANCE STRUCTURE

Our holding company has a solid, professional and long-term governance structure, the main objective of which is to guarantee the continuity of the business project, preserve its competitiveness and protect what gives it meaning: the company. 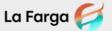
Family Council

This leadership is also projected internationally in the American market through our joint venture in the United States, where we have exported our unique and innovative technology to contribute to the development of a more circular and efficient industry globally.

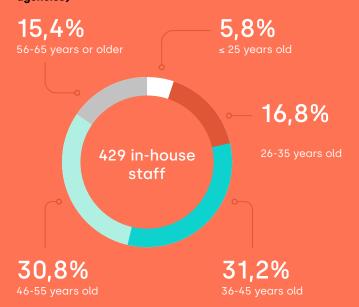

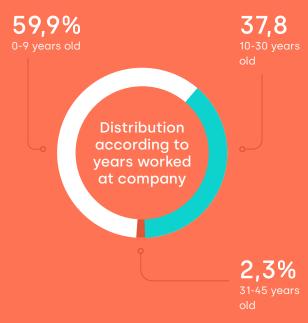
Workforce distribution by gender and age groups l(in-house staff, not temporary employment agencies)

DRIVING THE FUTURE: DEVELOPMENT AND OPPORTUNITIES FOR TALENT

We understand that talent management is one of the fundamental pillars for ensuring the legacy, impact and future of the organisation. We are committed to a comprehensive approach that goes beyond technical capabilities or experience, deeply valuing behaviours aligned with our values, attitude, motivation and commitment as differentiating elements of talent with potential. Because it is not just about what a person knows how to do, but how they do it and the impact they generate on their environment.

Leadership, within this context, is a key element. We have a solid, shared leadership model that sets a clear standard for excellent behaviour. This model, now fully integrated into our culture, articulates the balance between people management and business focus. It promotes skills such as team development, strategic vision, results-focused decision-making and creating a positive work environment. Leadership at La Farga means being a leader, fostering collective growth and making sense of our decisions, translating them into operational terms with coherence and commitment.

We have a skills assessment system in place for managers and employees (called SER for staff and MAP for specialist staff), supplemented by internal audits from the Human Resources department. Performance assessments are conducted for the entire workforce, which are essential for the professional development of our employees. We adapt the assessment processes to the specific needs of the different groups to meet the needs of each workplace, taking into account the specificities of their responsibilities.

PAS Evaluation (performance appraisal system): administered to 100% of staff twice a year and has established itself as a key tool for fostering honest, transparent and collaborative dialogue between leaders and employees. This process not only aligns expectations and recognises contributions but also facilitates the identification of opportunities for improvement and development. Tailored development plans are designed based on these conversations and strategic training initiatives are proposed, both at the company's request and based on the concerns and needs expressed by employees

MAP Evaluation (personal evaluation and improvement): conducted twice a year, this assessment measures key competencies such as adaptation, flexibility, self-learning and quality and results orientation. The process includes an assessment by the manager and a self-assessment by specialists

This process is designed to gradually encourage the assumption of new responsibilities, increase autonomyand develop key skills, such as the ability to identify and resolve issues, which allows for progress toward a higher level of coordination and performance. The 17 internal promotions registered this year—7 for staff and 10 for specialists—attest to the positive impact of these assessments on the team's growth and development.

Based on the results obtained from the performance assessments, we have developed a structured, data-driven, global talent management system. One of the key tools in this approach is the Talent Matrix, which includes nine areas that combine individual performance and

potential. This matrix allows us to view each employee's position within the organisation and analyse aggregate capabilities and gaps on a team, department, or professional group scale. This strategic view allows us to anticipate vacancies to be filled, identify development opportunities and design succession or mentoring plans.

The outputs of this analysis are translated into concrete actions, such as career development plans (CDPs), individualised development plans (IDPs) and collective training plans that respond to common needs. This allows us to align talent growth with La Farga's strategic objectives, ensuring a coherent and sustainable evolution of our people and the organisation as a whole.

ATTRACTING NEW TALENT

Attracting talent has become one of the greatest challenges for any organisation within a global context marked by a shortage of specialised and qualified profiles. We are experiencing a situation where finding the right talent is increasingly difficult and the real challenge in many cases involves developing it internally, "manufacturing" it through training, experience and support. La Farga understands that recruiting and retaining talent are two sides of the same coin. This inspires us to constantly work to strengthen and renew our value proposition as an employer, not only to attract new professionals but also to consolidate the commitment and motivation of those who already belong to our team. Because ultimately, our people are the driving force behind La Farga's transformation, innovation and future.

The opening of a new office in the centre of Barcelona in 2024 is an initiative promoted to attract more talent, promote work-life balance and expand La Farga's presence. This initiative also seeks to strengthen partnerships with schools, universities, customers and suppliers in the Barcelona metropolitan area.

In 2024, we also signed a partnership agreement with the ASSOCIATION OF INDUSTRIAL ENGINEERS OF CATALONIA (EIC) to join the ETalent alliance, an initiative aimed at promoting talent management and development in the field of engineering. This membership reinforces our commitment to ongoing training, internal promotion and connection with the most relevant professional ecosystem in the sector. It also represents a firm commitment to fostering our professionals' membership in the community of Industrial **Engineers of Catalonia**, integrating us into the most powerful and best-connected engineering group in the country, with the aim of continuing to promote the growth of technical, scientific and technological knowledge.



The connection with young talent is going from strength to strength thanks to our participation in events such as the second edition of Osona TicTalent, held in Vic and aimed at students of technological vocational training courses. This initiative led to four interns being taken on, two of whom went on to formally join the team, demonstrating the value of dual training and collaboration with educational centres in the region.

Dual Training is one of the key pathways we promote at La Farga to actively contribute to preparing the talent of the future. We work closely with local educational centres, such as IES Vic, La Salle de Manlleu and the Institut Cirvianum de Torelló [secondary schools], offering young students the opportunity to combine theoretical training with practical experience in a real industrial environment. This partnership has allowed us to support their professional development from the very start and provide them with an insight into the realities of the sector, facilitating their entry into the labour market with

a solid foundation of knowledge, skills and values.

The experience with interns is also crucial for professional development. Nine interns participated in the programme during the summer, which was strengthened throughout the year with the addition of five interns. The practical experience fosters knowledge exchange, paves the way for future job opportunities and enhances the work environment.

Participation in fairs and events such as those mentioned below also contributed to increasing La Farga's visibility as a quality employer.

- II GiraFeina, organised in Vic by the Chamber of Commerce, where our team presented job opportunities and shared experiences with other companies in the field of human resources.
- Top Talent by Santander, a fair organised by Universia aimed at recent STEAM graduates, during which we evaluated key skills using group dynamics, strengthening our bond with new emerging talents.
- Speed Dating Training and Work Foundation, an event aimed at facilitating the employment of women training as sales assistants, offering flexible interviews and promoting inclusive job opportunities.

These initiatives have provided an opportunity to showcase La Farga and the opportunity they represent has facilitated the presentation of job opportunities, the assessment of skills through group dynamics and the promotion of streamlined interviews, cohesively integrating the different projects that foster talent.

We understand talent acquisition as another process within our business, a collective effort that requires a solid collaborative network. Therefore, we establish strategic relationships with key providers in the training, institutional and job placement sectors, with whom we share goals and a vision for the future. These alliances allow us to expand our reach, access specialised graduates and jointly build innovative solutions to attract and prepare the talent our organisation needs. This close collaboration is a fundamental pillar of our people development strategy and reinforces our commitment to the sustainability of the industrial and social fabric of the surrounding area.

We managed to reinforce strategic alliances through a special event held in October with key providers in recruitment, training, consulting and educational institutions. This event allowed us to share the results achieved in recruitment, selection and retention, identifying challenges and opportunities to strengthen our talent strategy.

WE TRAIN PEOPLE, WE BUILD FUTURES

Training at La Farga is a structured, professional and planned process that follows a clear roadmap. Because we are all too aware that talent development does not happen by force of habit, but rather requires vision, strategy and consistency. Therefore, we understand training as a fundamental pillar that supports both individual growth and the organisation's competitiveness. Our training plan is structured at different levels, from basic training for the entire company to ad hoc programmes designed to meet both individual and collective specific needs.

We have a phased development model that supports employees throughout their journey within the organisation. We guarantee a comprehensive onboarding during the preparation stage that facilitates a smooth and secure integration. We work on developing technical skills, professional growth and the gradual assumption of responsibilities during the process, ensuring that each person is qualified to perform their role

with excellence. And once they get to the end, we promote continuous improvement, preparation for new challenges and the promotion of internal development opportunities. Because at La Farga, reaching the goal is not the end of the journey; it is the beginning of a new challenge.

We consider the training and development of our staff as a comprehensive learning and development process that allows them to acquire new knowledge, skills and abilities for the efficient performance of their duties.

We view ongoing training as a strategic element for both personal and professional growth and development across all levels of the company. We therefore implement a specific training plan tailored to the needs and objectives of each area, covering various training areas, such as technical and specialised training, occupational risk prevention and the environment, cross-cutting skills, interpersonal skills, languages, equality and sustainability.

We are committed to quality training, carefully selecting supplier companies while also considering local criteria to generate a positive economic impact in the region. We also continue to work with universities and specialised schools. Our investment in **training** allows us to promote the ongoing training of our team. Our training investment was €191,657 in 2024, representing a training investment of €440 per person—including our own staff and temporary employment agency staff. This investment translated into 80 of the 83 training activities planned in the 2024 training plan, achieving 96% of the plan. The 2024 training plan anticipates offering training opportunities to all groups within the company—management, staff, technicians and specialists—and ended up delivering an average of 30 hours of training throughout the year.

We have invested in programmes designed to meet the specific needs of our workforce.

Training in prevention and safety

Key courses and workshops on occupational risk prevention were held throughout the year (see the health and safety section for more details.)

Specific technical training

Advanced courses have been developed in key business tools and systems to enhance the technical capabilities of our employees, including:

- Excel, Power BI and SAP, which optimise data management and decision-making.
- Applied Artificial Intelligence, with a particular focus on tools such as GPT Chat and Copilot.
- Internal auditors trained in ISO management systems (9001, 14001, 45001 and 50001).
- Programmes have also been promoted on the circular economy and tools for a sustainable business transition, which promote innovation and environmental responsibility.

Training in abilities and skills

A range of training courses have been provided recognising the importance of interpersonal and leadership skills, covering:

- Empathetic communication
- Managing work teams and people
- Professional skills development
- PowerTeam to foster teamwork
- Certifications in team coaching
- The course for operator coordinators has also continued to be a pillar of internal development, focusing on industrial technical maintenance and strengthening interpersonal skills. The operator group is a key pillar of our production and organisational model. Within this context, specific training for operators is not just an operational necessity: it is a strategic priority.

We are committed to developing technical and cross-cutting skills directly in the environment where things happen: the plant. Because we believe that those closest to the process are also those who can best contribute to its continuous improvement, if they have the knowledge, autonomy and appropriate tools. We have been developing the Operator-Coordinator Programme since 2016, a 200-hour training initiative that takes place entirely at our facilities. This programme, accredited by the Generalitat de Catalunya [Catalan local government] as the best business practice in Vocational Training in 2021, aims to provide our factory specialists with a broader vision of industrial processes, preparing them to assume responsibilities in management, decision-making and incident resolution with sound technical criteria. Designed in collaboration with public organisations such as Creacció and the Paco Puerto Foundation (CCOO) and private stakeholders such as Shakeitup and our own technical team, this training programme represents our collaborative, applied learning model focused on real growth. More than 150 operators have completed the programme to date, nearly 50 of whom have been promoted to the role of operator-coordinator, contributing to an organisational transformation that

ZEUS II Programme: leadership for transformation

We launched the second edition of the ZEUS Programme, an advanced training programme focused on leadership development, within the framework of the Olympics Programme. Sixteen employees participated in a training programme in this year's edition, aimed at strengthening key skills such as teamwork, effective communication, planning, time management and adaptability. ZEUS seeks to consolidate a cross-cutting, conscious and transformative leadership, aligned with the organisation's current challenges and our culture of continuous improvement.

Corporate training for team leaders

A new training programme entitled "How to Conduct Selection Interviews" has been introduced with the aim of professionalising and improving our internal selection process. Through experiential sessions, this initiative has enabled managers to acquire skills to conduct effective interviews, objectively assess candidates' skills and promote fairness and transparency during the selection process.

Language Training

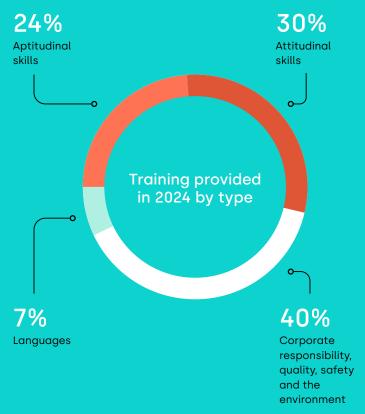
We have enhanced our workforce's language skills through in-person courses and specialised online language training. Of particular note is the focus on English through the Twenix platform, which allows our employees to develop essential communication skills in a globalised environment.

Each programme has contributed to enhancing individual and group skills, consolidating La Farga's future as an organisation committed to excellence and innovation.

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HEALTH, SAFETY AND WELL-BEING

The safety, health and well-being of people are non-negotiable at La Farga, which are the foundation on which everything else is built. We have adapted facilities and safe work environments but are aware that these alone are not enough. The real key lies in attitude, behaviour and collective awareness, the reason why we constantly work to build a shared safety culture, where everyone assumes their role and nothing is taken for granted. Never letting our guard down, never taking risks and always acting responsibly are fundamental principles we reinforce every day. Because ensuring a safe environment depends on everyone and begins with the conviction that prevention is not an obligation, but a commitment to life, the team and the future.



WE INVEST IN SAFETY, WE TAKE CARE OF OUR TEAM

Safety is a priority and a commitment. We have renewed our **ISO 45001** certification, the international **occupational health** and **safety** management standard, which demonstrates our firm intention to act within a solid framework of reference for the **prevention of occupational risks**.





€303,968 was **invested** in 2024 for **occupational** risk prevention (10% more than the previous vear), which included the purchase of personal protective equipment, the upgrading of firefighting equipment and the contracting of an external prevention service. This investment was accompanied by more than 280 actions that support our commitment to continuous improvement in workplace **safety.** These actions include adapting two machines to comply with **Royal Decree 1215/97** and a specific tool inspection campaign, which achieved a 45% reduction in accidents associated with their use. This led to a 20% drop in the total number of incidents (with and without sick leave), from 44 to 35 incidents.

La Farga's health and safety indicators, with a frequency index of 13.6, a severity index of 0.28 and an absenteeism rate of 7.16%, are well below the industry average (29.7 frequency index and 0.91 severity index for the sector *2023 data). These results demonstrate solid performance in occupational risk management, demonstrating that the preventive and continuous improvement measures implemented have effectively controlled incidents and minimised their impact on the safety of our workers and productivity. This approach positions us favourably to continue advancing toward an increasingly safe and sustainable work environment, reinforcing our commitment to excellence and the comprehensive well-being of our team.

We successfully implemented a **crash plan** in the foundry in 2024, leading to a considerable drop of 61% in incidents in that area. Also worthy of note is how no **temporary employment agency** worker suffered any **work-related accidents** this year, something we are particularly satisfied with, a direct result of the **yellow helmet** identification initiative for new employees, taking into account that **temporary employment agencies** represent 8% of total hours worked.

The initiative to visually identify new recruits with **yellow helmets** and experienced staff with **red helmets, launched** in 2022, has provided greater attention and support to new recruits, strengthening the **preventive culture** within La Farga.

The official **red helmet** presentation ceremonies continued to be held in 2024, a special recognition of colleagues who successfully completed their **Initial Training Plan (ITP)** and their commitment to acquiring the responsibilities that come with accepting the red helmet. This year, a total of 24 people received their **red helmet**, consolidating our tangible and transversal commitment to **safety**.

We have multidisciplinary work teams dedicated to improving our preventive culture

"Zero Accidents and Beyond" Work Group

Focused on promoting a **culture of prevention**, coordinating initiatives and ongoing improvements in working conditions and facilities

Health and Safety Committee

Composed of three employee representatives and three company representatives, who meet on a quarterly basis to plan and implement specific improvements

Safety Steering Committee

A strategic space in which members of the Management Committee participate, reflecting La Farga's commitment to security managed and led at all levels of the organisation. Because safety is not just operational; it's also a matter of leadership and corporate culture

2024 also saw important awareness-raising and training initiatives, such as Emergency Month (3 June to 5 July), an initiative that featured 44 training activities involving 870 participants and accumulating a total of 911 hours of training in occupational risk prevention.

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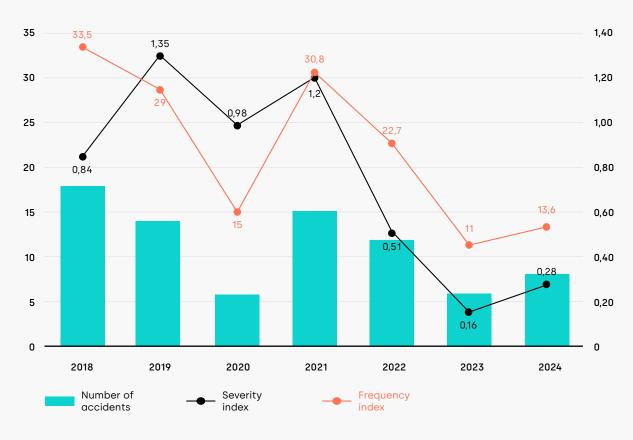
Industrial safety projects

Industrial safety is one of the fundamental pillars of our global strategy. At La Farga, we have invested significantly in safety projects, allowing us not only to comply with current regulations but also to ensure the protection of our team and the continuity of our operations. Some of the projects completed this year have included:

- New oil warehouse: Adapting a specific space for the safe storage of industrial oils, ensuring compliance with regulations and best practices.
- New corrosive products warehouse:
 Construction of a warehouse adapted for corrosive substances, improving safety conditions and minimising environmental risks.

These collective efforts have allowed us to make significant progress toward our **zero accidents** goal, reaffirming that **safety** is and will continue to be an unwavering value at La Farga.

WELL-BEING THAT INSPIRES, A TEAM THAT ADVANCES

People's well-being is a company strategy and a central pillar of our organisational culture. We are committed to creating a work environment where people feel good, cared for, listened to and provided with conditions that allow them to develop in balance, both physically and emotionally. We are aware that a team that feels good works better, is more engaged and actively contributes to building a positive and sustainable work environment.

Therefore, our Global Well-being Plan goes not only promote healthy habits but also strengthens the connection with the organisation, improves the employee experience and consolidates our position as an employer that puts people at the forefront. Because caring for well-being is not just a sign of responsibility: it is a strategic decision that directly impacts motivation, loyalty and the sustainability of our business project.

We firmly believe in the importance of promoting the overall well-being of our team because we want to foster a healthy and enthusiastic team. We therefore promoted various initiatives in 2024 within the Global Well-being Plan, aimed at improving quality of life, promoting healthy habits and strengthening interpersonal ties, fostering a healthier, more collaborative and motivating work environment.

In June 2024, we opened La Caseta de la Forja de l'Aram, a new well-being and development space that represents a firm commitment to people and the creation of work environments that foster growth, connection and coexistence. This project is part of our overall well-being strategy and has involved a significant investment (£118,000) to transform an old building into a modern, open and multifunctional space serving the entire organisation.

La Caseta was the result of a participatory process that many employees actively participated in from the design to selecting the name. The result is a completely renovated environment and integrated into the museum and natural space of La Farga, next to the Museu del Coure and the Garden. This complex now forms a top-quality social area, designed to promote personal and professional well-being.

The building features indoor and outdoor collaborative spaces, ideal for training, meetings, work sessions and activities related to health and development. An upper floor was also refurbished with a dining room and lounge area, designed to promote an informal opportunity for colleagues to socialise with each other and offer a quiet and pleasant place to unwind, mingle and socialise. La Farga works to take care of our people and La Caseta de la Forja de l'Aram is a tangible example of this commitment

We also held a **Healthy Walk** in commemoration of World Environment Day, which saw our team set off on a loop circuit from our facilities on 13 June together to discover and enjoyed the magnificent surroundings of the meandering Ter River. The walk proved to be an excellent opportunity to disconnect from the day-to-day routine, connect with nature and strengthen personal bonds among colleagues.

These and other initiatives that took place reflect our ongoing commitment to the overall well-being of the team, with the conviction that.

OUR TEAM, OUR BEST VALUE

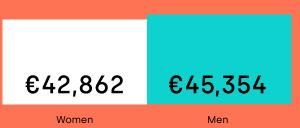
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We offer quality employment and remain committed to offering competitive salaries that recognise and fairly value the work of all people, without any discrimination. We are aware that certain job categories, such as those of specialists, are predominantly held by men due to perceptions associated with activities that have traditionally required high physical effort. This category continues to receive the highest bonuses, a factor that may influence the wage gap reflected in our indicators. However, our compensation policy maintains objective criteria, based exclusively on the responsibilities and skills inherent to each position, thus ensuring equity and avoiding any gender bias.

In 2024, the pay gap at La Farga stood at 5.5%, down from 6.5% recorded in 2023. This reduction reflects tangible progress in our commitment to pay equity, demonstrating that the actions implemented to ensure equal pay between men and women are yielding positive results. We will continue to reinforce our internal policies to consolidate this trend and continue moving toward full pay equity.

At La Farga, we believe renumeration as a strategic tool to recognise commitment, boost motivation and care for people at all stages of their working lives. We therefore offer a series of additional benefits in addition to the standard compensation package, which reinforce our responsible, approachable company model, aligned with the real needs of our employees. These benefits are not additional elements, but rather tangible expressions of our commitment to the well-being, recognition and development of our team:

Attendance bonus. This supplement recognises the perseverance and commitment of employees who maintain continuous and responsible attendance. In 2024, 85% of the workforce received this bonus, reflecting not only a high level of commitment but also a work environment that promotes stability and health.

Schedule pay. This benefit is granted based on the established work schedule and shifts, in recognition of the effort required to adapt to annual production planning. 100% of employees with an intensive or rotating schedule received this payment in 2024.

Performance evaluation-linked variable supplement. This variable compensation system is directly linked to the SER evaluation, which is administered twice a year. It rewards performance, continuous improvement, alignment with the organisation's values and contribution to collective goals. In 2024, 87% of those evaluated received this supplement based on their results, fostering a culture based on meritocracy and co-responsibility.

Accident or medical leave supplements. La Farga tops up Social Security benefits up to 100% of workers' regular salary in most cases for periods they are on temporary sick leave, especially in situations arising from work-related accidents. This measure seeks to protect the economic stability of employees and alleviate the impact of adverse circumstances.

School aid. Committed to supporting work-life balance and a healthy family environment, we offer annual financial aid to contribute to our workers' children's school expenses. In 2024, 179 people applied for this aid, totalling €42,000, demonstrating its value as a genuine support measure for the families of our organisation.

At La Farga, we believe that caring for people goes far beyond offering a competitive salary. It means building a work environment where well-being, work-life balance and recognition are integrated into the value proposition. We therefore have a set of measures and benefits in place that are part of a clear strategy: to be a modern, humane organisation committed to a work-life balance. These benefits are not privileges or one-off measures: they reflect a way of understanding labour relations, based on trust, respect and adaptation to a changing environment.

People's health is a priority at La Farga. We offer private health insurance to our staff, which supplements public coverage and facilitates rapid access to medical services. We also supplement Social Security benefits for workers on accident or sickness leave covering up to 100% of their salary in most cases, ensuring financial stability and peace of mind in times of vulnerability.

We also offer the "**We cook for you**" service, which provides healthy, pre-prepared, ready-to-go meals, facilitating a balanced diet without complications and promoting healthy habits in everyday life

Flexibility and work-life balance: a true work-life balance

Adapting to the environment is key. For this reason, La Farga has consolidated a flexible working-hours model and the option of working from home for our staff. Now that we are on the other side of the pandemic, we are committed to a mixed model that combines the best of both worlds: individual flexibility and enhancing collaborative and cross-functional work, while fostering team spirit and cohesion.

We also have measures that reinforce true work-life balance, such as a shorter annual working day than the one established by collective bargaining agreements, allowing our staff to work Fridays and designated days before public holidays without lunch in order to finish earlier, the ability to choose three days off per year and flexible holiday management tailored to the needs of individuals and the organisation. All these initiatives are designed to offer a more humane, balanced and respectful environment for different lifestyles.

Agora is much more than a meeting: it is an exercise in collective cohesion and leadership, where each participant feels an active part of the company's direction. Promoting these types of meetings allows us to strengthen organisational coherence, generate commitment and build a shared vision of La Farga's present and future together

Meridia

In 2024, the 14th edition of this annual communication space between the company and its specialist group was held. Relevant topics were addressed this year, organised into four sections: safety and the environment, the general situation of the company and the market and productivity and organisation, collecting their questions and concerns in advance and subsequently addressing them in live sessions with the Management Committee, organised during the different work shifts. More than 95 people participated in these one-hour sessions in the previous year, where they received firsthand information and customised responses. The topics discussed are analysed internally and, where appropriate, translated into improvement actions led by the areas involved

COMMITTED TO PEOPLE, CONNECTED TO THE COMMUNITY

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The true strength of the industry lies in its ability to generate economic and social progress for all

SOCIAL INCLUSION

At La Farga, we reaffirm our commitment to social inclusion and equity in the local community. We promote initiatives through strategic alliances and collaborations with various institutions that foster the integration of individuals and young people at risk of exclusion, strengthening social cohesion and paving the way for a more equitable future.

DUAL TRAINING IN COLLABORATION WITH THE ALBIR SCHOOL

We continued to strengthen our strategic alliance in 2024 with the Albir School through a dual training programme that facilitates the socio-economic and labour integration of these young people.

We hired two students that came from the Albir School for dual training this year. These students combined theoretical and practical welding training provided at the school with hands-on learning at our facilities, specifically in the Wire Drawing section. This approach has allowed students to consolidate their technical knowledge and acquire new essential job skills, such as teamwork, organisation, adaptation to different work environments and a stringent application of safety and occupational risk prevention measures.

The comprehensive training provided to these young people includes basic metalworking operations, electromechanics, forklift driving,

overhead crane operation and practical application of the 5S methodology, as well as other fundamental technical skills.

This initiative reflects our commitment to social impact, reaffirming the importance of dual training as a key tool for promoting employability, social integration and equal opportunities within our local community.







Dual Training with schools in the region

We actively collaborate with the IES Vic, La Salle in Manlleu and the Institut Cirvianum in Torelló on Dual Training programmes that allow young students to combine their academic training with practical experience in our industrial environments. This initiative contributes to preparing the talent of the future and allows us to identify, support and shape professional profiles aligned with the challenges of the sector.





Impulsa Foundation

We are acting as a mentor in this initiative that promotes equal opportunities for young people in socio-economically vulnerable situations. We offer support, guidance and real-life experiences in the professional world, facilitating their access to the labour market and fostering their personal and professional development.



ADFO (Association for the Physically Disabled of Osona)

While the direct integration of people with disabilities has not always been feasible in our industrial environments, we have established a stable partnership by contracting services that the group can offer with quality guarantees. This allows us to support their economic activity and enhance their social project.



Collaboration with La Cuina de Sant Tomàs

We offer a meal service to our team with quality, nutritious and locally sourced food in collaboration with La Cuina de Sant Tomàs, a local social organisation that employs people at risk of social exclusion.



Areté Foundation – Training and Socio-Labour Integration

We are involved in providing guidance, training and employability programmes aimed at people at risk of social exclusion in collaboration with this organisation. Our role is to open up real opportunities for internships and work, strengthening their transition to formal employment.

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LA FARGA FOUNDATION,

We are very aware of the social challenges of our community and are committed to the development of our environment as a responsible industry. This has inspired the **La Farga Foundation**, founded in 2004, to promote educational, cultural and social initiatives that seek to improve people's lives and create opportunities. Our commitment is to be a driving force for transformation, contributing to collective well-being through local initiatives and actions that make a difference.

We focus on our immediate area, which includes the regions of **Osona**, **Ripollès**, **Lluçanès and Moianès**, paying special attention to the municipalities of **Les Masies de Voltregà and Sant Joan de les Abadesses**.

The Foundation is managed by a **board of trustees from outside of La Farga**, composed of representatives of the business family, employees and external stakeholders, thus ensuring a diverse and inclusive vision. **Tristán Fisas** joined the Foundation's Board of Trustees as **Secretary** and **Marisa Gil** as **Trustee** in 2024, expanding the team and reinforcing our commitment to continuing to work on efficient management and significant social impact.

The La Farga Foundation currently manages a fund of €1,842,750, dedicated to supporting projects that promote knowledge, culture and social improvement in our community.







CULTURAL HERITAGE AND DISSEMINATION OF KNOWLEDGE

Copper Museum

The Copper Museum has been a benchmark since its opening in 2008 in the raising awareness about this metal and its impact on society. Located in an early 20th-century modernist building on the La Farga premises, the museum offers educational exhibits and guided tours that tell the story of copper and its key role in human development.

Inspired by our belief that **knowledge is key to transforming society**, the museum not only
showcases the history of copper and La Farga but
also invites visitors to learn how this metal drives
industrial progress, innovation and more efficient
and responsible development.

An **interactive walkway** allows visitors to observe the copper smelting and transformation production process in real time, connecting theory and practice. The museum is organised into four areas that allow visitors to explore copper from different angles: the history of La Farga, the origins of metallurgy, the properties of copper and its technological applications.

We also promote **educational plans and tours tailored** to all educational levels to raise awareness about this to new generations, from primary to university level, promoting learning and awareness about the role of copper in the world.

The **museum welcomed 1,815 visitors** in 2024, consolidating its position as a leading educational space in Catalonia. **New activities** were launched for different academic levels to strengthen its commitment to education:

The colony of La Farga

Aimed at students from primary and obligatory secondary education. This activity provides an insight into the history of La Farga as an industrial colony through a tour of the factory exterior, the museum and a visit to the production facilities. It includes a role-playing game where students take on different roles within the company.

The journey of copper, from the mine to everyday life Designed for secondary school and pre-university students, this activity explores the properties, uses and sustainability of copper, highlighting its relevance in our society.

Educational Toolkit: copper in the classroom

An educational tool that brings the museum experience into the classroom. Includes copper samples, activity guides and multimedia resources that explain the copper production process, from extraction to transformation into final products. This initiative seeks to offer an interactive experience that facilitates understanding of the importance of copper in industry and everyday life.









SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAMME FOR TRAINING AND INCLUSION

At La Farga, we are convinced that **education is the driving force behind change and progress.** This has inspired the **La Farga Foundation's** promotion of different **scholarship programmes** over the past 18 years, aiming to facilitate access to education and foster equal opportunities.

This year, we are launching a **new £10,000** scholarship for children with special needs, specifically for the **children of our La Farga** employees and partners. Our goal is to promote their educational and social development, reaffirming our commitment to inclusion and contributing to the integration and social reintegration of this group.

In 2024, we awarded a total of 19 scholarships worth €35,000, adding to the 844 we have awarded since 2006, with a cumulative investment of €1,210,462.

VICENÇ FISAS COMELLA AWARD

We presented this award once again in collaboration with the University of Vic, recognising the best academic projects that stand out for their contribution to **sustainability, innovation and social development**.

The award this edition, now in its 11th year, was

presented to Maria Gayà Rosselló, a Biotechnology student at UVic-UCC, for her study on the incorporation of microalgae into the human diet. This work culminated in the development of a prototype of cookies enriched with Chlorella, presented at the Barcelona Alimentaria 2024 Fair. This prize comes with a cash prize of €2,000.

LA FARGA DE L'ARAM AWARDS

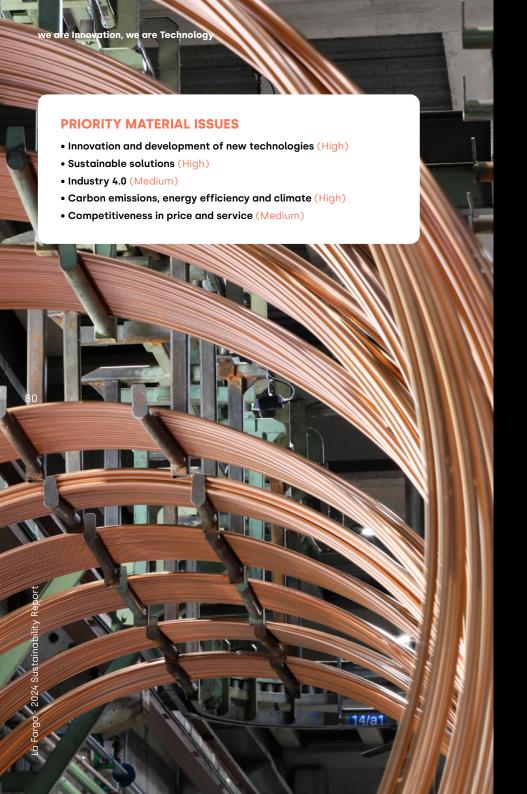
We held the **9th edition of the La Farga de l'Aram Awards** in collaboration with the **Vic School of Art and Design.** This year, the first prize, worth €2,000, was awarded to Kenai Rodríguez for his work "Diaphanity of the Night Sky", made of copper, steel and ceramics with the use of forging, welding and lathe techniques. The second prize, worth €1,000, went to Maria Ballart for her piece "Energetic Renaissance", crafted from steel, copper, bronze and resins using forging, casting and modelling techniques.

This year, we achieved unprecedented participation in the 9th edition of the La Farga de l'Aram Awards, with a total of 23 sculptures, surpassing all previous editions.

We are committed to a long-term vision, which allows us to assume the risks associated with innovation.

Our innovation approach encompasses every area of the organisation, from the continuous improvement of industrial processes, management methods, the implementation of digital transformation, and, above all, the ability to anticipate market challenges.

Innovation is our DNA, our raison d'être, something we drive across all levels with a vision for the future and the desire to transcend. As leaders and benchmarks in the copper sector, we develop advanced technologies that optimise the use of natural resources and improve efficiency in copper processing. We continually invest to continue growing, evolving and offering sustainable copper solutions of the highest quality, reaffirming our role as drivers of competitiveness, progress and sustainability.

TECHNOLOGICAL INNOVATION FOR SUSTAINABILITY, COMPETITIVENESS AND LONG-TERM **GROWTH

Innovation at La Farga is a cross-cutting concept that involves the entire company. It is driven from all areas of the organisation, from industrial processes to knowledge generation, training in innovation skills, organisationally to promote innovation spaces and the development of new work models. This comprehensive and collaborative approach allows us to foster a constantly evolving innovative culture, aimed at improving efficiency, competitiveness and the ability to offer increasingly advanced and sustainable solutions to the market. Our commitment to industrial and technological innovation is key to optimising processes, reducing impacts and anticipating the challenges of our environment.



The CIDI drives the innovation process from a strategic perspective

with the aim of anticipating the needs of the market and our customer companies. Its work allows us to accelerate the development of new products, improve operational efficiency and remain at the forefront of the sector through knowledge generation and collaboration.

The CAM

Is a multidisciplinary team that plays a fundamental role in the practical application of knowledge and innovation. Its work focuses on transforming ideas into tangible solutions through the development and implementation of new technologies that optimise our industrial processes and improve the efficiency, sustainability and competitiveness of our solutions.

We doubled down on our commitment in 2024 to industrial innovation with production improvements, improvements focused on increasing energy efficiency, improving operational capacity and expanding our product range, process optimisation and facility upgrades, among other initiatives. It involves an investment of €13.7 million, part of which will be reflected in 2025, These actions have been key to consolidating a more competitive and sustainable industrial model aligned with market demands. The most notable milestones include:

New copper tube machine

We have included a new production line that allows us to **expand the range of tubes** for the **refrigeration, air conditioning and industrial** sectors, increasing our sales capacity and market adaptation.

Optimisation of burners in our foundries' furnaces

The burner system has been redesigned to **improve its efficiency** and ensure optimal operation, which has led to **improved energy efficiency**.

Redesign of our foundries' furnaces

The new design provides greater **structural robustness**, improving raw material loading without compromising process stability or product quality.

Photovoltaic installation on industrial roofs

We have begun installing solar panels on all the roofs of our facilities, with the goal of achieving energy **self-consumption** from **renewable sources**, thus contributing to reducing our carbon footprint.

Machine vision system to detect defects

An automated inspection system has been implemented to **control product quality**, significantly improving service and **service quality and further strengthening our position** as a reliable, high-quality company.

Promote projects to maximise the use of recycled copper for smelting, refining and casting processes.

- Investment in new offices in Barcelona: We have opened new offices in Barcelona as part of our continued growth and expansion, which will allow us greater access to talent and help strengthen relationships with other company stakeholders, facilitating a modern and collaborative work environment.
- Diversification of technical gas suppliers:
 Specific investments have been made to expand the sources of supply of technical gases.

2024 has been a year of intense management, maintaining our efforts to promote investment and innovation management:

We have been **granted 9 patents** and have **2 that are pending**, consolidating our commitment to industrial property as a driver for standing out from the crowd and being competitive.

We are active in technological monitoring, analysing market developments and anticipating new trends relevant to the business.

We are active in innovation and currently have three projects underway that have been subsidised by the **CDTI** [Centre for the Development of Industrial Technology] and **ACCIÓ**.

We have an active network of partnerships. One example of this is the project we completed that was developed jointly with the Polytechnic University of Catalonia (UPC) on the potential use of impurities from the foundry production process for industrial applications.

We believe in collaborative innovation and, therefore, work closely with various research centres to combine capabilities and knowledge that drive new solutions and technologies.

























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INNOVATIVE MANAGEMENT

Our commitment to innovation also extends to our **management model**, which is evolving to respond to environmental changes, increase operational efficiency and effectiveness and generate a value that sets us apart.

We evolved established methodologies in 2024 such as:

LFCIS (La Farga Continuous Improvement System), based on the LEAN methodology and culture Promoting continuous improvement in our work. This year, we have focused on:

• Driving continuous improvement:

We are working in areas with the lowest level of achievement, identifying opportunities and optimising our processes to improve overall performance.

New organisation:

We are implementing new organisational structures that we refer to as Autonomous Management Areas, which accelerate decision-making and enhance the achievement of results.

Culture of innovation and customer focus:

We integrate innovation into each of our processes, ensuring that each initiative adds value for our customers. We are also promoting access to all groups to foster innovation across all levels.

New RADAR tool:

We have developed a tool that analyses the current situation and prioritises key initiatives, guiding our actions toward sustained improvement.

• Toward high-performance teams:

We continue working to transform our crossfunctional teams into high-performance ones, with the goal of achieving our 2025 goals.



Various initiatives have been reinforced throughout 2024 to consolidate **safer, more efficient and sustainable** workspaces, as detailed below:

- Safer and more efficient spaces: Specific actions have been implemented to maintain smoke-free areas, ensuring an optimal work environment.
- Integration into the safety culture: The 5S
 practices were incorporated into Emergency
 Month in 2024 and will also be incorporated
 into Safety Week in 2025, reinforcing their role in
 prevention and the continuous improvement of
 our work environments.
- Cross-audits: An external and interdisciplinary approach is promoted to identify areas for improvement and foster innovation in the organisation of the workplace.
- New training plan: A training programme
 has been designed to promote learning
 and improvement, ensuring the proper
 implementation of the 5S and elevating the
 safety culture throughout the company.

 19 OKRs were executed in 2024, 12 of which were
 completed and 7 were initiated, reflecting a high
 level of commitment and alignment across all
 levels of the organisation.
- This system allows each team to have a clear vision of the company's objectives and how they contribute value to the entire company, fostering cross-functional collaboration, agile decision-making and a culture of continuous improvement. LFWay represents the evolution of our way of working: an industrial company that operates with the flexibility, cross-functionality and impact-orientation characteristic of the most advanced organisations.

These models and methodologies allow us to continue promoting a **culture of cross-functional innovation**, to allow the La Farga team to continue to contribute to achieving results through continuous improvement, consolidating a more agile, competitive and resilient industry.

DIGITAL TRANSFORMATION, LA FARGA 5.0

We continue to advance in the inclusion of digital technologies within the framework of the La Farga 5.0 project, to optimise production, improve decision-making, enhance the productivity of our activities and streamline our ability to adapt to a constantly changing environment.

At La Farga, we understand that addressing these challenges requires the active collaboration of all economic sectors, public-private partnerships, to work together and build a more balanced and sustainable development model. Our firm commitment to innovation that is very much driven by sustainability, is our proposed solution to address the environmental challenges we currently face in our society.

We promote solutions that reduce emissions and promote a circular economy, demonstrating that the path to a more sustainable and responsible future is most definitely possible.

COPPER, AUNIQUE MATERIAL

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Copper is a metal with exceptional properties. It is a unique metal, properties that have made it a strategic and key material for sustainable human development.



Infinitely recyclable: Its ability to be recycled without losing its properties allows for its continued use, countering the depletion of natural resources.



Durability: Thanks to withstanding the passage of time without losing its properties, not rusting easily and being able to be used again and again without becoming degraded.



Excellent electrical and thermal conductor:

Properties that make copper a key material for the energy transition, for efficient electrification and for new mobility.

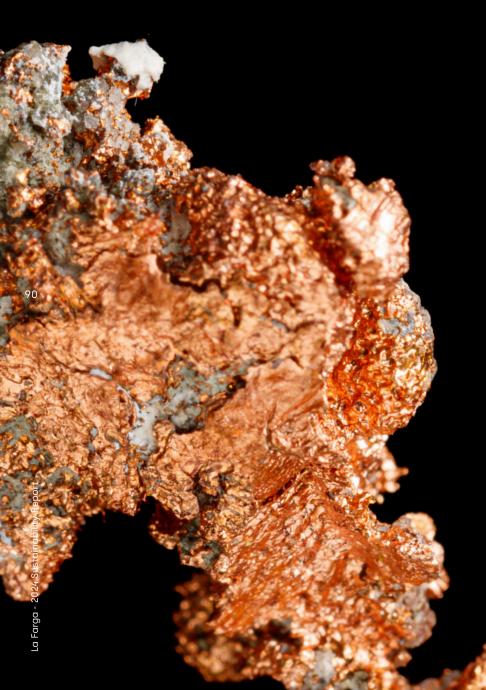


Versatility: Thanks to being the response for many applications such as electrical cables, tubes, technology, construction and many more, thanks to its ability to resist corrosion and its ease of moulding.









Copper is antimicrobial, the only metal certified by the EPA as a bactericidal agent. Its ability to withstand rapid temperature increases makes it a safe and healthy choice.

There are copper alloys that improve its qualities. It can reach the demanding levels of certain market applications.

At La Farga, we have the solution, which involves Efficient Electrification with copper processed with our unique technology, the result of our continuous innovation. Because copper is the best electrical conductor that is out there. This is thanks to its infinite potential to be recycled, allowing us to reuse it again and again without depleting natural resources. And La Farga has used copper to its maximum level of efficiency, with a unique process, the result of innovation and technology, that maximises its quality and minimises its environmental impact. This is how we lead the change toward a more sustainable environment, guaranteeing a vital resource for the progress and well-being of future generations.

Copper is present in multiple applications in our daily lives, such as:

- Homes, which contain an average of 200 kg of copper
- More than **10 tons of copper** are needed to electrify one kilometre of **high-speed train** overhead lines
- Electric vehicles require more than twice as much copper as combustion-engine vehicles.
 A combustion-engine car averages 20–45 kg of copper depending on its size, while an electric car uses an average of 83 kg of copper
- Solar panels require 5.5 tons of copper per megawatt
- Wind turbines require more than 4.7 tons of copper per 3 megawatts

The energy transition will drive growth in copper demand, as we have previously mentioned, due to being a strategic and necessary material for our development as a society. Current global copper demand is 26.5 million tons, with an estimated growth of more than double by 2050, reaching 60 million tons annually Of the total 26.5 million tons of copper consumed each year, more than 32%, a total of approximately 8.7 million tons, comes from the recycling of old scrap (copper contained in end-of-life products) and new scrap (generated during production and subsequent manufacturing processes).

This plan seeks to reduce direct emissions from our industrial processes while also striving to promote copper solutions that reduce the carbon footprint in end-use applications that use copper.

Our decarbonisation plan establishes clear and ambitious goals, highlighting our commitment to reducing greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions by 55% by 2030 compared to 2019 levels and achieving carbon neutrality (Net Zero) by 2050.





Our decarbonisation plan is structured around six pillars:

O1 Purchase of green energy

Promoting responsible and sustainable consumption by establishing agreements with suppliers to ensure that all supplies comply with Guarantees of Origin (GdO) (scope 2).

02 Energy efficiency

Implementing improvements to current facilities and/or production processes to reduce energy consumption (scope 1 and 2).

03 Energy autonomy

Developing investments to promote energy generation and achieve energy autonomy in a competitive and sustainable manner (scope 1 and 2).

Production process optimisation

Simplifying facilities and electrifying as many processes as possible (scope 1, 2).

05 Sectoral efficiency

Developing technologies for the efficient use of existing natural resources. Introducing sustainable solutions (scope 3).

06 Innovation

Developing new, alternative and competitive technologies to reduce gas consumption in metallurgical processes.

This comprehensive approach allows us to address emissions reduction from a global perspective, fostering the development and implementation of cutting-edge technologies, optimising each link in the chain and promoting the use of certified clean energy, among other levers of action.

NOTEWORTHY ACTIONS

La Farga 🧲

We have spent years working and investing resources to improve our energy efficiency and reduce carbon intensity, allowing us to optimise our consumption and total emissions, achieving lower consumption for higher levels of production. We continued to make progress on our decarbonisation plan in 2024, which brings us ever closer to our goal of finding alternatives to current fossil fuels and combating climate change. Below are the main actions and projects that took place in 2024:

- Installation and commissioning of rooftop photovoltaic panels
- Start of the Solar Garden project
- Optimisation of the furnace burners at our foundries
- Transition of company vehicles to HEV or electric vehicles
- We prioritise intermodal transport, thereby reducing the transport environmental footprint
- We are testing the possibility of implementing transport fleets that use biofuels on a recurring basis
- We are applying continuous improvement to energy consumption ratios, implementing digitalisation to improve our efficiency
- We conduct regular external energy efficiency audits at our plants
- Improvement of consumption measurement equipment in our industrial facilities

We are developing the following initiatives that will have an impact by 2025 with the aim of continuing to drive our transition toward cleaner and more efficient production:

- Electrification of production processes. Achieving a drop of 485 tons of CO₂
- Improvement of our smoke purification system.
 Additional reduction of 528 tons of CO₂
- Optimisation of our foundries, aimed at optimising energy efficiency and significantly reducing natural gas consumption. Projected reduction of 1,068 tons of CO2

We have defined a medium-term strategy (2026-2030) with a view to consolidating our commitment to sustainability that integrates technological innovations and resource optimisation to achieve ambitious decarbonisation and energy efficiency goals:

- To advance the electrification of industrial processes
- To expand the self-consumption of solar energy
- To increase the use of recycled raw materials to significantly reduce Scope 3's carbon footprint through our production process, which leads to a ten-fold energy consumption
- To reuse of waste heat

We have spent years working and investing resources to improve our energy efficiency and reduce carbon intensity

INNOVATION IN SUSTAINABLE SOLUTIONS

Our investment in more sustainable copper solutions is a cornerstone of our decarbonisation plan and drive for the circular economy. For every ton of recycled copper processed using our unique process, 3.3 tons of CO₂ emissions are reduced, which is equivalent to taking two combustionengine cars off the road for a year or planting 130 trees.

We guarantee the traceability of our copper solutions by performing life cycle assessments (LCAs) and registering environmental product declarations (EPDs). These tools validate our processes and reaffirm the traceability and continuous improvement of our copper solutions.

GENIUS copper wire rod represents the ultimate example of La Farga's commitment to innovation and sustainability. It is the result of years of work, specialised technical knowledge and constant investment in R&D to transform copper recycling into an advanced industrial solution, capable of meeting the highest standards of quality, efficiency and traceability on the market.

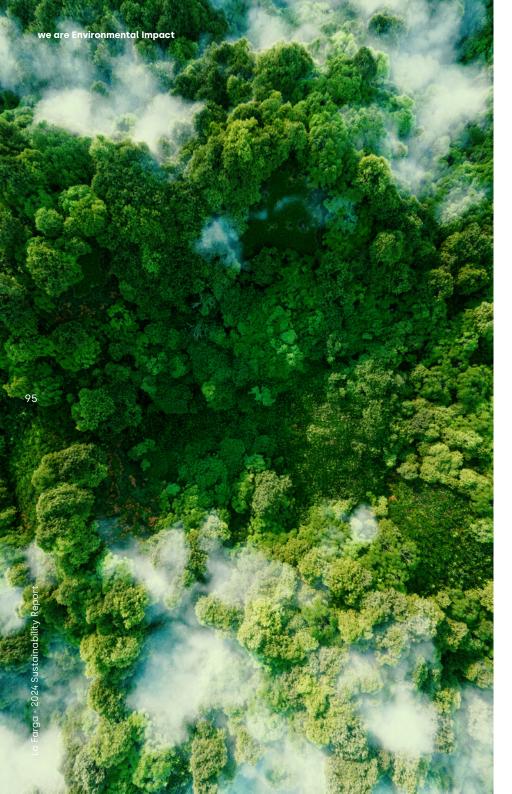

Manufactured with 100% recycled and recyclable copper, GENIUS offers the lowest carbon footprint on the market (0.3 kg of CO₂ per kilogram), well below the industry standard. This excellence has been recognised with the Environmental Product Declaration (EPD), making La Farga the first company in the sector to obtain this certification for a copper wire rod. This distinction validates GENIUS as the most sustainable product in its category, with a more than 92% drop in CO₂ emissions reduction compared to conventional processes.

GENIUS is not just a product; it reflects a model of innovation serving sustainability. A solution designed to respond to the demands of decarbonisation in strategic sectors such as electrification, mobility, rail and construction. At La Farga, we work to anticipate global challenges by offering **copper with a real positive impact**, without compromising performance or technical reliability. Because we believe that the industry of the future is built on solutions that respect the planet and add value throughout the entire chain.







ENERGY CONSUMPTION AND EMISSION REDUCTION

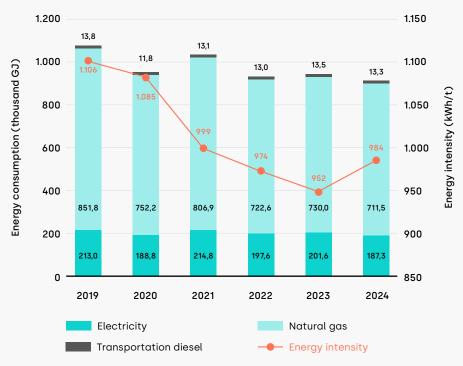
We are intensive in terms of our energy consumption, due to the high temperatures required to melt copper and this poses a global technological and regulatory challenge to access alternative energy sources. This challenge requires research and development and collaboration with research centres, to find an alternative in the near future. We also need to promote public-private collaboration to achieve a regulatory framework that favours the transition to alternative fuels.

At La Farga, we are fully aware of this reality and are working to reduce our energy dependence, with the medium- and long-term goal of finding competitive and sustainable alternative energy sources. While we continue working to find these energy alternatives, we continue to optimise our energy efficiency to the maximum extent possible. The ISO 50001 certification obtained in 2023 has laid the foundation for us to continue optimising our energy consumption in 2024 by identifying savings opportunities and implementing systematic measures throughout the organisation.

One of our energy management objectives is to strive for maximum efficiency. We use renewable energy sources and 100% of the electricity consumed at La Farga is certified renewable. We have managed to reduce our total CO₂ emissions (combining Scopes 1 and 2) by 37%, equivalent to a reduction of approximately 22,076 tons of CO₂. This is equivalent to planting around 1.08 million trees* [*The calculation has been made considering that a mature tree absorbs an average of 20 kg of CO₂ per year].

At La Farga, we rigorously measure our emissions in scopes 1, 2 and 3. Overall, the 2024 data show a reduction in direct emissions (scope 1) thanks to lower consumption of natural gas and diesel, the latter primarily due to the progressive implementation of the forklift electrification plan, as well as the consolidation of the zero-carbon footprint electrification process (scope 2) This is also due to the implementation of continuous improvement in our energy management.

We achieved a reduction of 11% in energy intensity compared to the reference year of 2019.

5.3. CIRCULAR ECONOMY, OUR MODEL; THE FUTURE, OUR RESPONSIBILITY

The Circular Economy is part of La Farga's DNA, the cornerstone that guides our business model, our innovation and our commitment to sustainability. Our purpose, "to maximise the use of recycled copper and develop the technologies that make it possible", defines who we are and how we operate.

In a context of growing pressure on natural resources, promoting circularity is an undeniable responsibility. Before extracting, we must firstly reuse everything that already exists: only then can we sustainably respond to the growing demand for raw materials driven by the energy transition, electrification and economic growth.

Global consumption of copper scrap currently represents approximately 32% of total copper consumption, while at La Farga, we achieve 59% recycled raw material in our processes. This demonstrates not only the significant room for global improvement, but also that La Farga is already at the forefront, effectively leading the shift toward a more efficient and sustainable industrial model.







We are firmly committed to promoting solutions that maximise the use of existing resources, reducing environmental impact and promoting industrial growth compatible with the limits of the planet. We must foster these principles through our business model:

- Reducing dependence on natural resources
- Improving the efficiency of production processes
- Extending product lifespans
- Recycling products that reach the end of their useful life, reintroducing them into the system and recycling them as efficiently as possible

All the solutions La Farga offers respond to and apply these principles. According to the Ellen McArthur Foundation, "The Circular Economy is an opportunity to redesign our system, creating economic, environmental and social value". This principle permeates both our business model and our corporate culture.

In 2024, we smelted 247,979 tons of copper, of which 59% of the raw material used was copper reintroduced into the system, using our unique process that allows us to produce wire rod directly from scrap.

We apply the principles of the Circular Economy to all our activities, not just with copper, with the aim of seeking maximum efficiency in the use of resources. We perform stringent controls of the consumption of materials per unit of product produced, striving for constant optimisation. We implement advanced waste management, progressively increasing the percentage of waste that is recycled or recovered compared to that destined for end-of-life. We use water responsibly, working with systems that allow us to recycle water in our processes, ensuring efficient use and reducing overall consumption.

At La Farga, innovation is very much driven by sustainability, the reason why we continue to invest in continuing to develop solutions to maximise the efficiency of our circularity.

Organisationally speaking, we have several multidisciplinary teams focused on optimising raw materials and maximising the use of recycled materials

We are improving our facilities (a new wastewater treatment plant) to allow us to be more efficient

We have several projects underway to increase the consumption of recycled copper in our production processes to achieve our goal

We comply with the requirements of the Catalan Water Agency (ACA) for water use, with a plan to reduce water consumption

Development of new circular solutions

- Genius CuAg wire rod, manufactured entirely with recycled copper. Primarily for the railway industry
- Publication of the La Farga Wire Rod Carbon Footprint according to ISO 14067 and the development of a life cycle analysis (LCA) that allows tracing and certifying the circularity of the materials used on the MITECO website (scopes 1 and 2)

OUR ENVIRONMENTAL MANAGEMENT

We actively manage our environmental impact by applying innovation and continuous improvement with specific actions and measurable results. Our focus this year has been on implementing effective measures to reduce the ecological footprint of our operations, identifying opportunities for improvement and implementing specific controls. We have also made significant progress in complying with current environmental regulations and integrating increasingly sustainable practices into all of the company's activities. We have been ISO 14001 certified since 2001, which guarantees compliance with international environmental management standards and reinforces our commitment to sustainability. And in 2024, we dedicated a total investment of €79,733 to minimising our environmental impact.



WATER CONSUMPTION

Climate change has intensified droughts, compromising the supply and access to water, a vital resource in the current context. La Farga, located near the Ter River, has a water source that has been essential for cooling and powering machinery using turbines. This connection takes on special relevance in a situation involving water scarcity, underscoring the importance of responsibly managing this fundamental resource.

Our response has entailed adopting innovative measures to optimise the use of this vital resource and ensure its long-term sustainability. This year, we have managed to reduce our water consumption by 16.9% compared to the baseline consumption established by the ACA [Catalan Water Agency] due to the drought period. And we have reduced water consumption by 6% in 2024 compared to 2023. We have also implemented a system to utilise stormwater retained in underground channels and improved the efficiency of treating water discharged into the collector, through operational adjustments such as pH control and the installation of a turbidity meter to continuously monitor the quality of discharged water.

These actions reinforce our commitment to sustainable water resource management, providing solutions to current environmental challenges.

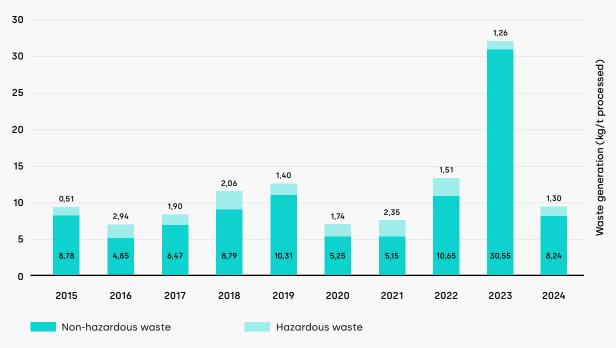
WASTE MANAGEMENT

We continued implementing comprehensive measures in 2024 to reduce the volume of waste generated in our operations, both at the plant and in our offices, reintroducing as much waste as possible into the system and giving it a new life. We have increased waste segregation at our production facilities by introducing new, specific R&D codes, with a special emphasis on organic matter.

Total non-hazardous waste production has remained stable and we have managed to reduce ordinary waste sent to landfill by 34%, demonstrating our commitment to more sustainable management. Total waste recovery (excluding ordinary waste and debris) has increased by 8%, promoting the circular economy and the utilisation of generated materials.

We have also managed to reduce hazardous waste generation by 4%, reaching the lowest level in the last four years, thanks to the implementation of new measures and a more effective monitoring system.

Waste generation per ton processed 2024



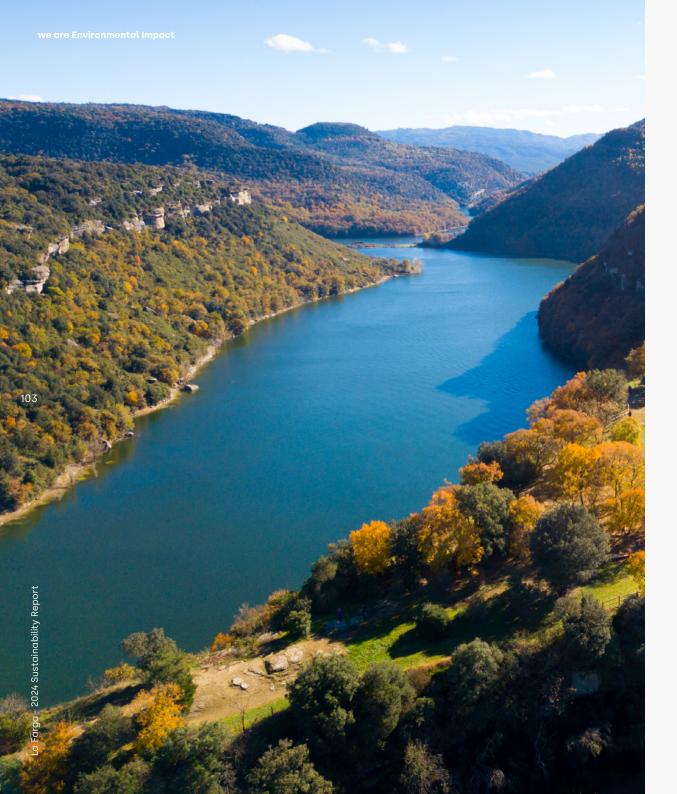
ACOUSTIC IMPACT MITIGATION

The well-being of residents near our facilities and our employees is a priority for La Farga, the reason for our stringent noise control. Every two years, we prepare an acoustic control report to assess our impact and establish mitigation measures. The latest report, conducted in 2023, recorded an impact of 49.03 dBA, a 2.67 dBA reduction compared to the 2021 report.

Significant improvements were implemented this year to continue reducing our acoustic impact, including:

- The new design of the furnace burners, which reduces noise
- Improvements to the insulation of our facilities
- Requirement to purchase new machinery, which cannot exceed 80 dB(A) under any circumstances

These actions reinforce our commitment to continuous improvement for well-being and improving the quality of life in the environment in which we operate.

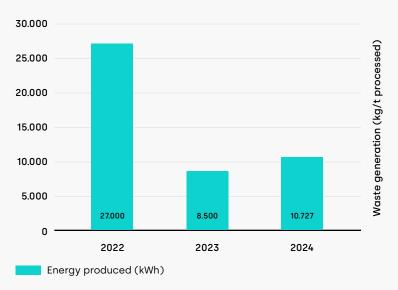




BIODIVERSITY PROTECTION

We have a responsibility to promote the preservation of the Ter River ecosystem. we conducted sampling in collaboration with the Catalan Water Agency, which confirmed that the river's biological quality remains at an acceptable level according to the BMWP index. Persistent drought conditions have prevented quality from being higher, as in the case in previous years. Aware of the importance of not aggravating the situation, we will continue to limit and reduce the use of our hydroelectric plant in 2024, restricting its operation to periods when the river flow allows.

COPPER: A CHALLENGE AND A SOLUTION

The global economy is being redefined by a growing commitment to a more efficient, responsible and sustainable future. This transformation towards an Impact Economy is driven by the collective will to promote development that balances economic progress with social and environmental wellbeing. In this context, strategic sectors such as electrification, renewable energy, automotive and transportation, digitalisation, to name a few, are experiencing unprecedented growth. According to the European Union, copper is a key material in this transition, being essential in 78% of the strategic technologies identified by the EU. The data supports the magnitude of this challenge. Between 2024 and 2030, the renewable energy market is expected to grow by 22.7%, electrification by 25.1%, automotive and e-mobility by 18.9% and digitalisation by 10.9%.

And they comply with the principles of the Circular Economy, returning the waste to the recycling process in a continuous and cyclical manner, turning it into a new product.

Thanks to its **high yield and durability**, this wire has become a key solution for packaging in sectors such as **food, aerosols, industrial** products (paints, varnishes, oils, etc.) and **veterinary** medicine, where welding quality is a critical factor.

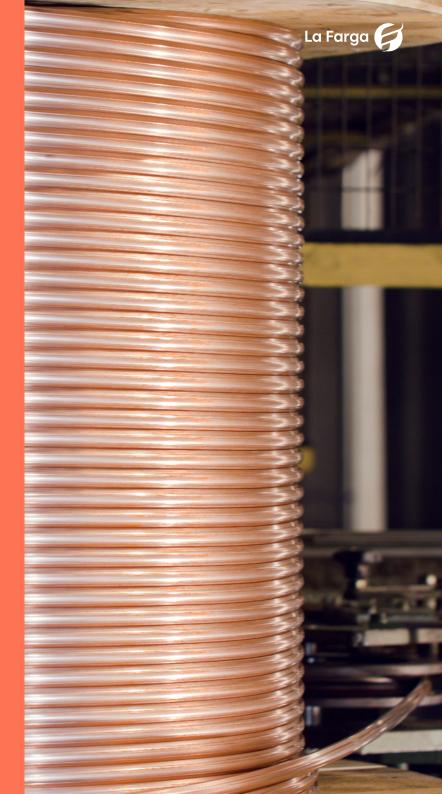
Railway cables

SUCCESS STORY: CIRCULARITY PROJECT – LA FARGA, ABB AND CELSA

The CIRCULARITY PROJECT, a pioneering collaboration between ABB, CELSA and La Farga, is a major milestone in the promotion of the circular economy. This agreement reinforces our commitment to closing the loop in the value chain, recovering and reusing essential materials to reduce the extraction of natural resources and minimise waste

The project's objective is to replace ABB's obsolete electric motors with more efficient technology, ensuring that their constituent materials, especially copper, are recycled and reintegrated into the production chain. This extends the useful life of the resources and contributes to a more sustainable industry.

A key part of this initiative involves La Farga's recovery of the copper from ABB's electric motors, applying its own innovative technology to transform it into a 100% recycled product. This process allows copper to be reintroduced into the market with a significantly reduced environmental impact, leading to a 92% reduction in CO₂ emissions and a 99% reduction in water consumption.

This project demonstrates how **innovation and sustainability go hand in hand when working together.** As Carles Camprubí, Director of Circularity at La Farga, pointed out, this agreement represents a real commitment based

on collaboration and positive impact, maximising the concept of the circular economy.

Initiatives like this allow La Farga to reaffirm its role as a leader in the transition toward a more efficient and sustainable production model aligned with the principles of the circular economy.

COMMITMENT IN ACTION: STRATEGIC COOPERATION FOR A SUSTAINABLE FUTURE

The world's first copper overhead lines made with Genius copper.

A historic collaboration between La Farga, ProRail, Strukton Rail and Railtech BV was formalised in 2024, with the aim of installing the world's first copper overhead lines in the Netherlands, made with Genius copper, 100% recycled copper and 100% recyclable copper with the lowest carbon footprint. This innovative advance in rail electrification will contribute to a 92% drop in CO₂ emissions, a milestone that underscores the stakeholders' commitment to sustainability and the circular economy.

The signature of this agreement took place during the 11 2024 international event in Berlin, one of the most important trade fairs in the railway sector. This project not only marks a significant step in the transition to more sustainable infrastructure

but also highlights Europe's role as a leader in green electrification and the fight against climate change. The alliance between La Farga and its partners reinforces our collaborative strategy, demonstrating how the combination of knowledge and experience can generate a positive and tangible impact on the sustainability of the railway sector.

BUSINESS MODEL FOR RAW MATERIAL COPPER

The copper market faces increasingly complex challenges, from price volatility to geopolitical instability and regulatory pressures. In **2024**, these tensions have highlighted the need for **resilient**, **reliable**, **traceable and sustainable** supply chains.

La Farga has developed a **strategic procurement plan** that allows us to **guarantee the supply of raw materials** and do so under the **highest standards of ethics, transparency and sustainability.** This ensures operational continuity without compromising our values or the future of natural resources.

Our supply policy is guided by the principles of **ethics, sustainability and transparency**, where legality and best practices prevail over any business opportunity.

Our relationship with our **copper raw material** suppliers—including cathode, alloy metals and scrap—is based on **mutual trust**, **technical collaboration and continuous improvement**. This collaborative approach allows us to guarantee the quality, traceability and sustainability of our supply, key elements of our industrial model. In 2024, these suppliers achieved an **average score of 97 out of 100** on the evaluation index, reflecting the high level of compliance and alignment with our standards and values.

- After the European geopolitical conflict broke out, La Farga made the decision not to purchase cathode from Russia, reaffirming that our principles go beyond finding the lowest cost.
- We promote a transparent and traceable sector in terms of human rights, ensuring that our suppliers comply with international regulations and sustainability standards.
- We apply our Code of Conduct in all our operations, reaffirming La Farga's commitment to conducting its activities and business in compliance with applicable laws and the highest standards of business ethics.
- We maintain close and ongoing collaboration with our suppliers, building relationships based on transparency, regulatory compliance, and innovation in materials management.
- We promote the traceability and safety of our raw materials, ensuring stringent control from source to final delivery.

The copper supply is divided into two main sources: mining and scrap. Mining requires large investments with long-term returns, of up to a **decade**, which limits its immediate expansion capacity. While Europe does not have the mines to generate sufficient raw material, it is in itself a copper scrap "mine" as an older society and a major consumer of copper over the years that can be given a new lease of life and reintroduced into the system. China's industrial growth in recent **decades** has also generated a significant volume of products now reaching the end of their useful life, increasing the availability of recycled copper. However, investment must continue in recycling **technologies** to maximise the recovery of copper at the end of its useful life, especially in the recovery of copper from electronic applications, which will allow for better use of this resource in the coming years.

Our commitment is clear: to ensure the supply of raw materials without compromising our values, promoting a more ethical, traceable industry aligned with the principles of global sustainability.

The transition to a sustainable and electrified world requires copper, the key of which lies in optimising the use of materials. Mined copper continues to be necessary to make this possible and scrap must be incorporated into the most efficient stages of the chain, maximising the impact.



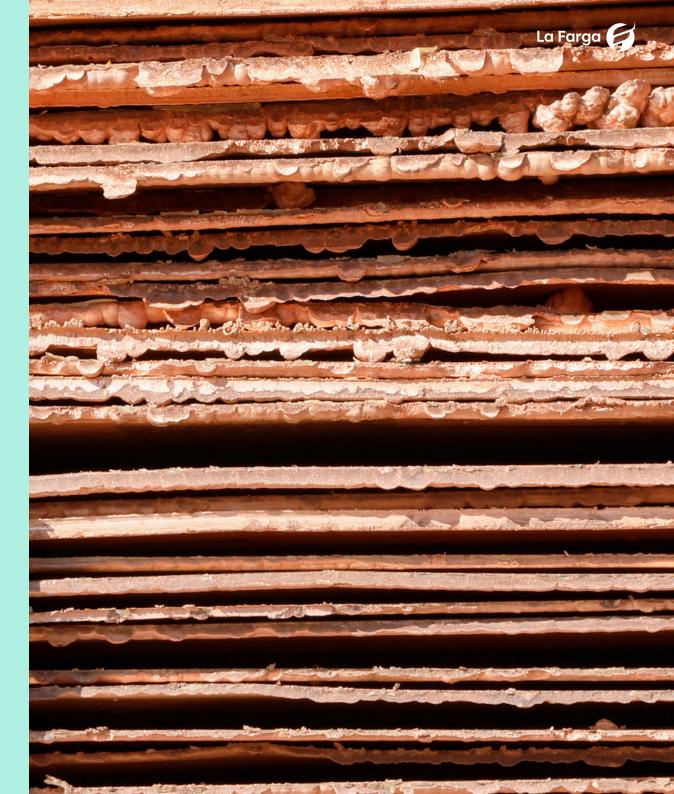
CATHODE AS A RAW MATERIAL

It is obtained **mainly from mines** through the extraction of minerals with low levels of copper and goes through several stages to become 99.99% pure copper cathodes.

La Farga implements several key actions to ensure traceability and quality in the cathode supply chain:

- Compliance with product quality specifications.
- Implementation of systems that increase logistical and financial flexibility.
- Maintenance of solid medium- and long-term contractual relationships to ensure supply.
- Diversification of our portfolio to ensure a stable supply, especially in terms of growing copper demand driven by the energy transition.
- Continued restrictions on the purchase of Russian cathodes due to the geopolitical conflict in Europe.

We work with our suppliers to ensure copper traceability and we apply our Code of Conduct in all our activities and operations, ensuring compliance with applicable laws and the highest standards of business ethics. Our Code of Conduct and its associated policies establish the ethical and legal framework that governs all our actions and activities, ensuring compliance with applicable laws and the application of our ethical principles.







SCRAP AS A RAW MATERIAL

The scrap used by La Farga comes from endof-life copper products or by-products, such as
scrap cables from electronic equipment, tubes,
building cables, power lines and waste from
production processes. We stand out thanks to
our unique process of transforming scrap through
refining, which allows us to produce semi-finished
copper directly from scrap. This treatment
removes impurities, ensuring maximum quality and
efficiency.

This process allows us to by-pass intermediate steps, producing directly from scrap Copper's recyclability gives it an unlimited lifespan, allowing us to reintroduce it into the system countless times without losing its properties, ensuring its long-term durability through various applications.

Raw material quality control is fundamental to our process. We apply quality controls and analysis in our scrap truck laboratory to ensure its quality. We apply a continuous improvement approach to optimise this process, that reinforces our knowledge of recycled materials and strengthens relationships with our suppliers, thus fostering long-term relationships.

We have a **traceability policy** in place that guarantees the **origin** of our **raw materials**. We work closely with our **suppliers** to improve **traceability systems and mechanisms** and we have protocols for **reporting** and **collaborating with the authorities** if there is any evidence that questions its **origin**.

Raw material quality control is fundamental to our process.

EFFICIENCY, SUSTAINABILITY AND POSITIVE IMPACT ON THE SUPPLY CHAIN

Sustainability is a central focus of our activity, something that goes beyond the manufacturing of our products, the reason why each link in the chain and everyone involved is important in our work to maximise our positive impact. One example of this is the implementation of projects that promote responsible purchasing of materials other than copper, prioritising efficiency, proximity, carbon footprint reduction and circularity. By 2024, 24% of all non-copper purchases will have been made locally (in the Osona region). And 69% of total purchases were made in Catalonia and 91% in Spain.

We also maintain a strong relationship with our suppliers of non-copper materials and services, focused on efficiency, innovation and sustainability. We work in a coordinated manner to ensure that their products and services add value to our operations. In 2024, La Farga obtained an average score of 86 out of 100 on the evaluation index, highlighting our shared commitment to quality, operational improvement and environmental responsibility.







COPPER SOLUTIONS WITH SUSTAINABLE PACKAGING

We continued our goal of achieving minimal impact in 2024 with the packaging components of our solutions.

- Wood: 100% of the wood coils and 83% of the pallets used in our products are PEFC-certified, guaranteeing that they are manufactured from responsible timber forests.
- Wooden pallets: apart from certifying our pallets as responsibly sourced, we have also implemented recovery measures and reduced packaging purchases. Today, we recover more than 37% of the jumbo pallets used in our operations, in addition to increasing overall pallet recovery from 17% to 20%, which significantly reduces the purchase of new packaging.
- 79% of the plastics used in our film packaging and 78% of the plastic used in strapping come from recycled materials.
- 67% of the cardboard used in our packaging materials is 100% recycled.

POSITIVE IMPACT ON THE SUPPLY CHAIN

- Water resource management: We are implementing a project at our facilities to achieve 100% water supply connections within the next two years, replacing water bottles with water tanks. This not only improves water quality but also eliminates the need to deliver and refill bottles, reducing the environmental impact.
- PPE and occupational safety: The safety of our team is always our priority and we are optimising the procurement processes for Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) and work clothing, improving both delivery efficiency and the operation of self-service machines. This measure contributes to reducing the environmental impact associated with transportation in addition to streamlining internal management.
- External and local staff: We continue approving local external staff and services. This process seeks to find local companies to offer the necessary services, validate and approve them, optimising their working hours to maximise service efficiency and reduce emissions generated by travel.
- Spare parts, supplies, tools and additives: We prioritise local suppliers and competitiveness over price when purchasing these supplies to reduce distances and reduce our carbon footprint. We have also initiated a project to reduce the purchase of additives from distant markets, incorporating closer suppliers and minimising their environmental impact. Promoting local purchasing has a dual impact because we also foster economic growth in our surroundings.
- Technical gases and emissions reduction: We have optimised the purchase of technical gases by applying local criteria, which has allowed us to reduce emissions associated with transportation and improve the efficiency of our supply chain.
